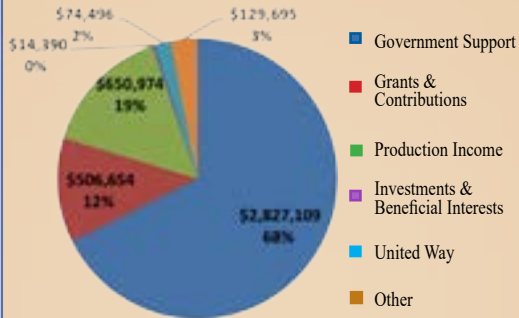
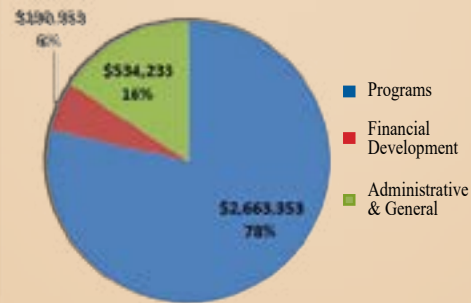


## FY 2014 - 2015 Revenue & Expenses



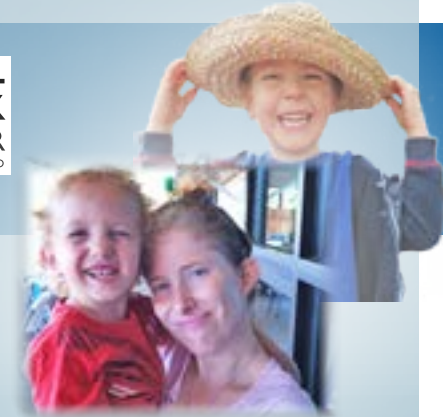
**Total Revenue – \$4,182,526**

## Life Enhancing Activities Working For A Better Life Program (LEAP)

*Increases opportunities for adults with developmental disabilities to be active participants in the community through art, community integration and social enrichment.*

### *Serving 55 participants*

**55** adults participated in activities and outings enhancing their lives  
**32** in vocational services and LEAP

*Assists people with varying abilities to enter the workforce by developing needed job skills, participating in the discovery process and building self-confidence and social skills, while earning paychecks in our skill development center or in community employment.*

### *Serving 279 participants*

**93** workers located, obtained, and maintained community employment  
**155** adults worked at *Pearl Buck Production Services*  
**35** adults participated in a combination of programs  
**31** adults lived independently through our *Supported Living Program*

## Pearl Buck Preschool Program

*Children learn critical social/emotional and preliteracy skills in an enriched learning environment, so they enter kindergarten ready to learn. Their parents receive training and support in their parenting efforts.*

### *Serving 253 participants*

**253** adults and children in **67** households (unduplicated numbers).

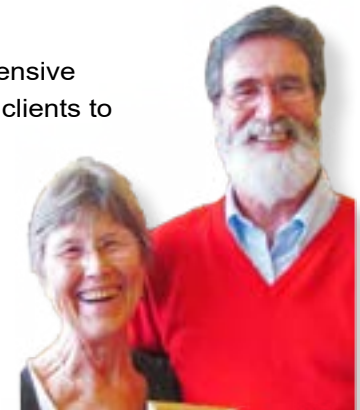
