A Time of Transformation

We have just completed another significant phase in the transformation process. With sheltered services due to close August 28, 2020, we have one additional year of this change ahead of us. We have planned and prepared with our clients for their new futures. Already, two thirds of those in our sheltered services have chosen other opportunities for their lives, including Pearl Buck Center programs such as Project SEARCH, Pearl Buck Vocational Academy, the Life Enhancing Activities Program, or Community Services.

We will complete our final phase in the transformation to community-based employment services with a continued focus on our Mission and strong partnerships.

Although sheltered services as defined in government contracts are ending, we are not closing any other part of our programs. This includes Production Services and the myriad of supports we have offered since 1953. Over time, these services have changed with community demands and regulatory requirements, but the guiding force of our clients has remained steady.

As our namesake Pearl S. Buck stated, "All things are possible until they are proved impossible and even the impossible may only be so, as of now." When law and lawsuits caused a new direction for us, it seemed impossible to determine how we would get through such enormous challenges. Yet, we are moving forward with new programs, and anticipated growth! New futures are still possible, even for those who have been with us for decades. As we are heading toward the "home stretch" of this challenge, it is clear we can do this. We can do it best together, particularly because we can see all that is possible for the people we support.

This program provides Job Discovery to determine the right fit for available jobs, Job Development for those ready to work, and Supported Employment so clients can remain successful in their jobs.

Supported Living

Assists individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities to live as independently as possible in their homes while remaining safe. This can include, but is not limited to: household cleaning and maintenance; meal planning and preparation; grocery shopping; and money management.

Increases opportunities for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities to be active participants in the community through art, community integration, and social enrichment.

Pearl Buck Preschool & Family Supports

Wrap-around, tuition-free preschool and services for families led by parents with cognitive limitations.



Pearl Buck Preschool uses specialized curriculum and positive behavioral supports to provide children with language/literacy and social/emotional development needed for kindergarten readiness.

Family Supports are provided to every family with a child enrolled in the preschool. Additionally, our staff provides Family Supports to families referred to us through outreach and by DHS Child Welfare. Our wide range of support services include:

- Parenting Education and Support adapted for adults with cognitive limitations, provided at Pearl Buck Center and in home visits.
- **Case Management**, a collaborative process of assessment, planning, facilitation, evaluation, advocacy, and coordination of care to provide families with support to meet basic needs and maintain a safe and stable home.

Did you know: 55% of all families served by the Preschool and Family Supports Program have some level of involvement with DHS Child Welfare. Our staff support, engage, and educate parents with cognitive limitations as they work toward positive resolutions.

Project SEARCH

Project SEARCH is a nationally acclaimed nine-month internship program.

Pearl Buck Center's Project SEARCH program prepares individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities for community employment with on-the-job experience and skill building through a nine-month internship rotation program. So far, two national awards have been granted to this program for its success rate.

This year, twenty interns successfully completed the program at Sacred Heart Hospital at RiverBend & University District and Graduate Eugene (formerly the Hilton Eugene).

Vocational Academy

provides an exciting combination of classroom learning and hands-on work experience, and promotes community involvement through guest speakers and field trips.

Individuals of diverse capabilities and backgrounds are prepared for competitive jobs in the community through **personal development**, **career exploration**, and **job-specific training** using differentiated, person-centered instruction.

The Vocational Academy is licensed through the State of Oregon as a private career school.

Center Pointe Services

The goal of **Center Pointe Services** is to improve the efficacy and long-term sustainability of Pearl Buck Center and other agencies working with people with I/DD. This is done through providing support and consultation for NOTO, financial services and business consulting.



NOTO is a web-based client data management software developed by Pearl Buck Center staff. The benefits of using NOTO include:

- Securely access client data, records, notes, and documents from any location
- Easily track outcomes for clients in both time and quality
- Identify trends in client behaviors or changing needs
- Reconcile state billing across all data systems
- Save staff time (and money) with more efficient, streamlined processes

Center Pointe Services are provided internally to Pearl Buck Center staff, and externally to business customers. We currently have five such customers and continue to grow.









